## Our Mission

*The mission of ASTT is to alleviate the suffering of those who have experienced the trauma of torture, to educate the local, national, and world community about the needs of torture survivors, and to eliminate torture in the world. ASTT was founded in 1994.*

At our two offices in Washington, D.C. and Baltimore, MD, we provide:

- counseling and specialized treatment in a safe, caring, and confidential environment;
- psychological assessments;
- expert testimony for asylum cases;
- access to social services and resources, including medical and legal assistance, housing, language training, and employment opportunities.

In addition to these direct services for survivors, ASTT also:

- provides specialized training for legal and health professionals in order to increase their ability to respond to the needs of torture survivors;
- raises community awareness about torture, its consequences, and the needs of survivors;
- advocates for the abolition of torture worldwide through publications, the media, conferences, and other forums.

In Baltimore and Washington, D.C., ASTT promotes acknowledgment of torture as a global concern and provides insight into the experiences and circumstances of survivors .

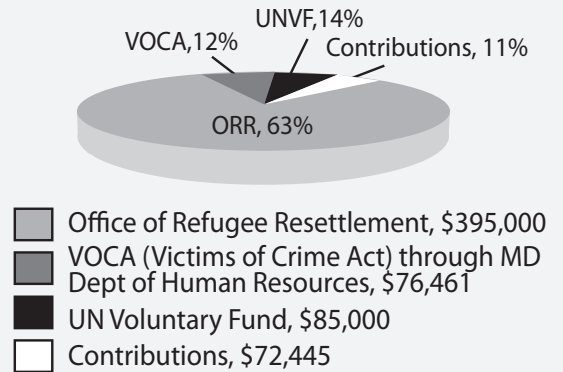

## DEMOGRAPHICS AND PROGRAM ADDITIONS

In the past year, ASTT provided therapy and case management for 303 clients from 25 countries. 97% of clients are from countries within Africa. The top countries of origin are Ethiopia (48%), Cameroon (26%), Eritrea (7%), and Rwanda (4%). The remaining clients are from 21 other countries in Africa, as well as from Europe, Asia, and South America. 49.5% of our current clients are women 50.5% are men. The majority of ASTT's clients are women and men ages 25-44.

Case managers recorded goals set by clients as part of a "Personal Wellness Plan." On the average, clients completed 80% of their goals over the course of this twelve-month period. In the past year ASTT has made great efforts to continue offering a wide range of services to clients. We have also made headway in increasing organizational capacity to expedite services for new clients. Additionally, we continue to think of new ways to broaden our psychosocial and therapeutic group offerings for current and future clients. Our Life Skills group in Washington, D.C. continues to be a success with clients attending in record numbers.
